Our event, hosted on the picturesque campus of Chestnut Hill College in June, marked another milestone in our journey. As our Scholars navigate the challenges of being first-generation college students, your unwavering support has been a beacon of hope. The resilience and determination displayed by our Scholars continue to inspire not only our team but also their families, mentors and fellow Scholars.

I am thrilled to share that, once again, we surpassed our fundraising goals for the year, having our best year yet with over \$600,000 in revenue. This achievement has allowed us to extend our reach and provide additional crucial wrap-around services in vital areas such as food, housing, and mental health therapies. Your contributions have directly impacted the lives of these young Scholars, offering them essential support as they embark on their educational journeys.

It's important to recognize that research indicates borrowers of color often face significant challenges in education finance, struggling with repayment and having fewer resources, which can have far-reaching consequences on their mental health. Your generosity is instrumental in breaking this cycle of poverty, enabling our Scholars to focus on building a bright and prosperous future.

Since our inception, we have served 66 young scholars, soon to be 72 with our 2024 cohort! By year end 2024, we will have graduated 16 Scholars, helping them to achieve the economic mobility that will lift them, their families and their communities. In 2024, we will be celebrating 7 college graduates from Pennsylvania State University, Williamson College of the Trades, Cornell University, Georgetown University, Temple University and Chestnut Hill College.

Thank you for being an integral part of our mission. Your commitment to the Brighter Horizon Foundation is transforming lives and creating a positive ripple effect within our community. We look forward to keeping you updated on the progress and successes of our Scholars as they continue to thrive. Wishing you joy, good health, and prosperity in the coming year.
